
# Where does a jack-o'-lantern come from?

When they are ready, the pumpkins change from green to orange. Now they can be picked.

Every year, people grow bigger and bigger pumpkins. In 2012, the largest pumpkin weighed 2,009 pounds (911 kilograms). That's just more than a ton.
